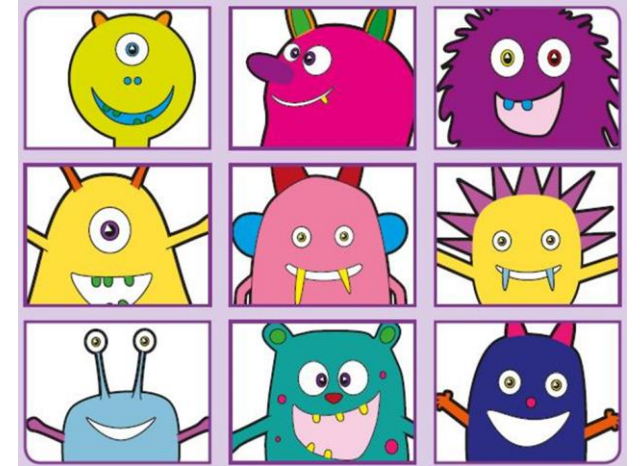


The Phonics Screening Check



What is the the Phonics Screening?

- National Phonics check
- Aimed at assessing if children have developed appropriate decoding skills
- Allows us to see if any children require further support



What does it look like?

- Total of 40 words
- 20 real words and 20 alien words
- First 20 focus on skills learnt in Reception
- Second 20 focus on skills learnt in Y1
- Words increase in difficulty

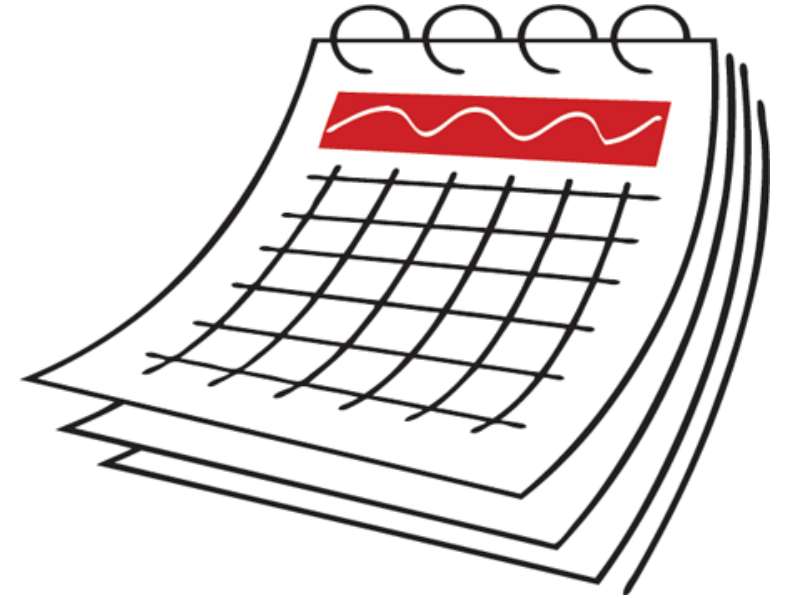

When does it take place?

- Any children that are absent can be picked up the next week



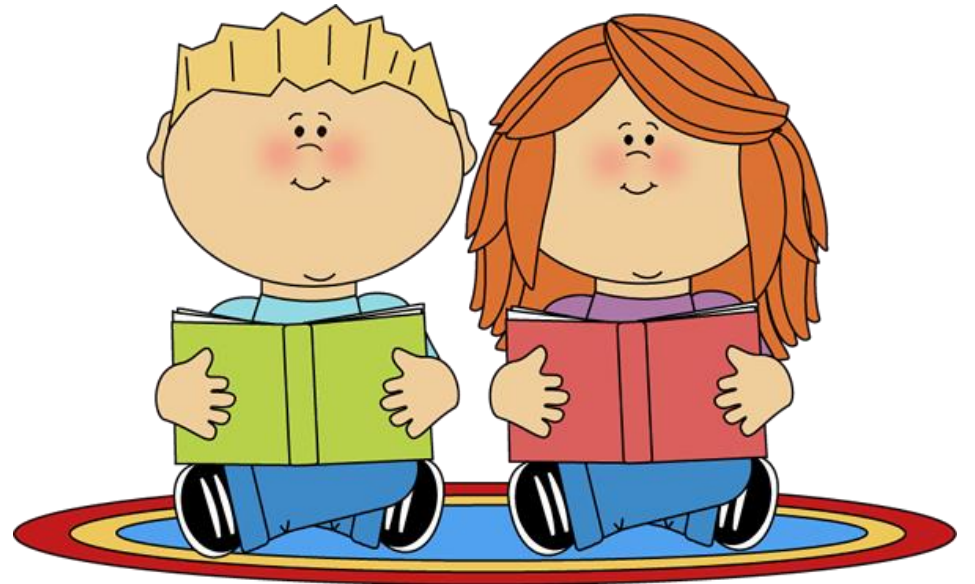
How does it take place?

- Calm and quiet environment
- One to one with their current teacher
- No time limit
- Read at their own pace



How is my child preparing at school?

- Daily phonics lesson
- Daily practise reading real and alien words
- Intervention
- Whole class reading
- Opportunities for reading for pleasure



What can I do with my child at home?

- Read
- Complete practise material sent home
- Make real and alien word flash cards
- Access phonics videos and games on-line
- Practise using the Reading Eggs programme



What happens if my child does not pass?

- They will receive some extra support to further develop their decoding skills.
- They will have another opportunity to take the screening.
